What is the Suzuki Method?

- ◆ **PARENT INVOLVEMENT:** As when a child learns to talk, parents are involved in the musical learning of their child. They attend lessons with the child and serve as "home teachers" during the week.
- ◆ **STARTING EARLY:** Listening to music should begin at birth; formal training may begin at age two or three, but it is never too late to begin.
- ◆ **REPETITION:** Constant repetition is essential in learning to play an instrument. Children do not learn a word or piece of music and then discard it. They add it to their vocabulary or repertoire.
- ◆ **READING COMES LATER:** Children learn to read after their ability to talk has been well established. In the same way, children should develop basic technical competence on their instruments before being taught to read music.
